The Church Media Speicialist will be responsible for running the livestream video feed and in-house audio for our Sunday morning 11am worship service. The candidate should be familiar with or willing to learn basic mixer controls, Microsoft Office, OBS, Facebook Live, Restream, and YouTube. They will be responsible for the following tasks every week:

- 1. Create and upload slides for our livestream participants to follow along at home.
- 2. Create the presentation that displays the media using OBS.

3. Configure the livestream parameters and update the web site to link to the stream as needed.

- 4. Turn on equipment, make sure microphones have freshly charged batteries, etc.
- 5. Mix house sound.
- 6. Mix livestream sound.
- 7. Operate cameras.
- 8. Operate slides.
- 9. Watch comments for quality control or other needs.
