News From Your Community Pastor

Dear Church,

As my due date approaches, I'm hearing several questions about my leave, the baby, and Jake's and my plans. While we will be figuring out many things on the fly, I'm sure, here are some answers to some frequently asked questions!

When does Hannah's leave start and how long will she be away? Barring unforeseen circumstances, I will be on a "staycation" with my feet up June 5-11. My 12 weeks of parental leave will be June 12-September 4, during which time I will be intentional about not checking email, responding to work-related texts or phone calls, conducting pastoral care visits, attending church events/functions, or officiating weddings/funerals. I will return to work and church activities after Labor Day on September 5 and look forward to celebrating Rally Day with you and the baby at the church Pig Pickin' on September 10!

When can we meet the baby? Jake and I will share baby news virtually via a congregational email as soon as we are able. Don't worry we will include pictures! When we are ready to introduce the baby to his church family and vise-versa, we will attend worship with him at some point over the summer. He will also be toted around to many-a-church-function in the fall!

Who should I contact about _____? I have been working with elders and ministry leaders for youth, children, education, and Community Partner ministries. If you aren't sure who to contact, the church office can direct you to the appropriate person to answer your questions.

Why isn't Hannah responding to my text/email/phone call/inquiry? I will be away from all workrelated communications for the duration of my leave. I will catch up slowly in September *but I recommend re-sending any important notes I may have missed then.* In the meantime, the office will help you find answers to your work questions.

And finally, the most frequently asked question:

Does the baby have a name? He will, we promise!! We have a short list of names but do not plan to name him until we meet him, whenever he arrives!

Jake and I have felt so loved and supported by our church family these past several months. As we near the end of pregnancy and the beginning of parenthood, we are grateful for your prayers that our little one will arrive safe and healthy (and without too many problems for his momma!) We are excited, bewildered, beloved—and immensely grateful. Thanks for helping to stock his nursery and clothe his tiny body, and thank you for making sure Jake and I are fed in the weeks following his birth. You are our village—and his. We are blessed.


- 1. Create and upload slides for our livestream participants to follow along at home.




