Dear Church,

When I came to you fresh out of seminary and in the middle of a global pandemic, you welcomed me with open arms. Some of you set up a tent in my front yard, and the rest of you came by my house to meet Jake and me and offer gifts for our pantry—the old southern tradition of "Pounding your Pastor" (like a pound of flour, a pound of sugar, etc.). I held office hours at Books and Beans and met you in the safety of the open air in the middle of the August heat. My first Sunday was recorded in the sanctuary where I preached only to Matt and a camera and you worshiped from home with a recorded service. On Rally Day that year, I met you all for my first in-person worship service on the front lawn of the church. We had a pre-packaged breakfast and released butterflies to the sounds of the bagpipe from folding chairs.

Not going to lie, it was a weird start to ministry. And I know it was weird for you too. None of us knew what to do with the pandemic nor what the next day would hold. It was a tiring time for us all, but we persevered, and my next years with you were filled with much joy and connection as we worked to reengage as a community. We resumed youth trips to Montreat and the ski slopes, we started small groups like Sip & Chat and Heretics. We planned Evensong services and service projects and trips around the community to listen and pray. We gathered for pancake dinners and March Madness parties, met in living rooms and coffee shops, breweries and fellowship halls. My hope has been that with every step, we become more and more a place of intentional belonging.

In 1 Corinthians, Paul writes "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the growth." In my time with you I have done my best to sew seeds of care and connection, engagement and service throughout our shared life as a church. It is now time for another to come in and water those seeds with you, to tend them and help them become more than what they are now—or perhaps help them become something entirely different. But it is God that gives the growth—not your pastor. In each season of the church's life and regardless of pastoral leadership, it is God's vision that takes root and blooms. So in this time of transition that you enter, take comfort and trust that God is at work and that the seeds we've planted together these past 3-4 years have not fallen on bad soil.

In a relatively short amount of time, we've been through a lot. The world has changed drastically and the Church-at-large has too. You mean a lot to me, and I will miss you. I'm grateful for you and hopeful for your future—lean into hope, tell a good story of the church, and trust that God is growing the seeds of comfort, connection, service and care.

God knows what will bloom.



They will be voted upon at the upcoming November 5th Congregational Meeting. This team will ultimately be responsible for securing an interim pastor. We will continue to keep you updated on the Interim Search process via the monthly newsletter and/or weekly emails.

Their five basic functions are to:

- 1. Manage the transition process when a pastor departs
- 2. Facilitate a healthy ending to pastorate
- 3. Support the remaining staff
- 4. Develop a plan for the search for Interim/Transitional Pastor
- 5. Communication with Congregation as to how transition is being managed.






Communications Deadlines
