Hello, Folks,

This is my first monthly newsletter. I'm pleased to do so, because I can reach out to you differently from my Friday letters and Sunday services. That said, I'm certainly impressed with the energy and dedication I see among you. You try things, you pitch in, and you ask lots of questions. The rich tapestry of things you do brings the community of faith together. Many congregations today face severe issues relating to Covid's onset. Many stopped in-person worship for a whole year—meaning older people, young families, and the health-compromised dropped out.

Less so here I think. Last week I went to the potluck supper (delicious) and sat with the Choir singers. Lots of inside teasing and conversation—but I didn't at all feel like an outsider because they made me feel quite at home—explaining little nuances that I would have missed completely. Other examples abound. People stop in to introduce themselves and say hello—quickly adding that they don't expect me to remember their names, giving me the slack I need to get to know you. And Session, as they govern the church is careful to explain how FPC does things; but is quite open to my suggestions and new ideas. Why? They understand that "doing church" is very different from pre-Covid days. Before that famous saying, *"15 days to stop the spread"* came to haunt us as days turned into weeks and then into months as we watched the whole world came to a standstill. Yes, doing church is much different today.

Which brings me to the transition work before us. My job is to assist you in deciding what you want this church to become. Once determined, a church ministry profile will articulate the church to interested candidates. Certain pastors reading it will feel "tugged" by God and will be excited to talk further. And our pastor nominating committee will find the pastor God has already chosen to come lead you into an exciting and faith-filled future! So I'm excited for you and for our journey together over the coming months.



2024 Total Pledges Received as of 1/29/2024: \$581,750






## Serving our neighbors and each other!

First Presbyterian Church of Rocky Mount embraced challenges with change during the year of 2023. The growing needs of our community, church and congregation continued to be met with open hearts. 45 women pledged their support to the PW this year. For various reasons, it was decided that the existing two Circles would combine into one. Circle of Friends and Circle of Joy are now the Circle of Joyful Friends. Each month the members gathered to study, learn and to share in service to others. At least 22 women came together to study New Horizon's Sacred Encounters. We participated in the Birthday offering, the Least Coin offering and the Thank Offering. We supported our own through our card ministry, flower ministry, and handcraft ministry. We supported the Littrell – Thorpe scholarship fund through the sale of Easter lilies and were able to offer funds to 7 of our college students. Along with our church, food drives and supply drives allowed us to contribute to Peacemakers, Southside Academy, and United Community Ministries. We worked together and continued to meet the changing needs of our congregational family, the residents of Covenant Homes, the students and staff of Tar River Academy, the children at Peace Makers, the women and families at My Sister's House, and the missions of the Agape Village.
