Lenten Season

We are in the midst of Lent, named after an old English word for Spring – meaning the days were growing longer. England's latitude is significantly higher than ours. North Carolina is ~35° above the Equator, but England's southernmost point is ~51°, equal latitude with a spot roughly 600 miles north of Toronto, at Hudson Bay's southern tip! At that latitude, coming spring days lengthen much faster than here in North Carolina. So the Roman Empire's English Christians saw fast-lengthening days as a time for fresh thoughts and growing faith.


This year, Easter falls on March 31st. It occurs in the month of March again in 2028 and 2032. But 600 years ago Easter's date was a problem. Not because of the Church, but because of the calendar used to define it. The Julian calendar (named after Julius Caesar) had a small mistake in its calculation of the solar year—each year was too long by 11 minutes and 14 seconds. This inadvertently added an extra day every 128 years. So by the year 1500, the equinoxes (spring and fall) were off by 11 days. This caused a problem for celebrating Easter, which the Council of Nicaea set in 325 as the first Sunday following the first full moon after the spring equinox.

During the reign of Pope Gregory, a new calendar was devised to account for this error. It also meant that they had to adjust the calendars to account for the now "extra" 11 days. The church decided to correct the problem and the Pope issued a Papal Bull in 1582 declaring the switch to the new calendar would fix the problem. Without going into the fascinating details of how various European countries did it, in 1582 the day after October 4th was October 15th! This put the spring equinox back to March 21, where it's stayed since.

So for me, this conjunction of science, history, and faith is the perfect way to think of the vastness of God's omnipotence. Which, of course included sending Jesus to live among us and show us the way and the truth and the life! And to sacrifice himself so that we might have everlasting life. Have a contemplative Lent!



Good News! Beginning in Jan. 2023 and after many visits to different doctors, I was finally diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndrome(MDS) which is a rare group of blood cancers that causes the abnormal development of blood cells in the bone marrow. This causes refractory anemia . The HGB hemoglobin (Hgb) test measures how much hemoglobin your red blood cells contain. This blood carries oxygen to the rest of my body. It also is reason I have a very hard time breathing. My HGB has been extremely low for many months ranging from 6 to 7. I have ended up in the hospital and have had many blood transfusions.
